Part One: General Code of Behaviour for International Learners

RATIONALE

It is imperative that learners are safe time during their enrolment at Wakatipu High School. There is also a mutual understanding that all partners want learners to take best advantage of the opportunities available to them while at Wakatipu High School, and in New Zealand. The below points clarify what Wakatipu High School expects of international learners. This should be read in conjunction with the code of conduct for homestay. Fail to follow these will result in disciplinary action.

PURPOSES

- 1. To ensure that legislative requirements are met.
- 2. To protect the interests of the learner and the school.
- 3. To ensure a learner is able to take full advantage of the educational and co- and extra-curricular opportunities Wakatipu High School has to offer.

GUIDELINES

International learners at Wakatipu High School will:

- 1. Always behave in ways to stay safe themselves and keep others safe
- 2. Follow and not violate the laws of New Zealand
- 3. Follow the Wakatipu High School Homestay Code of Behaviour
- 4. Follow the Wakatipu High School Code of Behaviour
- 5. Study to the best of their ability
- 6. Participate in sport and/or other school activities where possible
- 7. Wear the school uniform correctly at school and to and from school
- 8. Attend all scheduled classes unless unwell or on school-based activity/trip.
- 9. Be on time for classes, and arrive with correct equipment ready to learn
- 10. Use the internet responsibly. Use of VPN is not allowed at school.
- 11. Use approved electronic devices in class for schoolwork
- 12. Not purchase, own or drive a car, motorcycle or motor scooter. Not ride as a passenger driven by someone with a restricted license.
- 13. Only travel outside of Queenstown with approval from the school.
- 14. Not hitchhike
- 15. Stay in homestay accommodation approved by the school
- 16. Be respectful of homestay property
- 17. Let the host family know where they are at all times
- 18. Seek approval in advance for overnight stays away from the homestay address
- 19. Not smoke or vape, or possess equipment for smoking or vaping
- 20. Not possess or drink alcohol
- 21. Not possess or use drugs (other than for a diagnosed medical condition)
- 22. Report problems to the International Director or the Homestay Coordinator





Part Two: Attendance

RATIONALE

Regular attendance will allow a learner to take full advantage of the educational opportunities offered at Wakatipu High School and to achieve successful learning outcomes. A learner must attend 90% of all time-tabled classes in each subject to meet course completion requirements. If the learner's attendance is under 90% for their course, then Wakatipu High School may choose to terminate the learner's enrolment. New Zealand Immigration will be informed of any learner whose enrolment is terminated.

There is a mutual understanding that all partners want what is in the best interests of the learner. Policy and procedures must exist to ensure that such situations are dealt with in a manner which is fair to both the learner concerned and the school.

PURPOSES

- 1. To ensure that legislative requirements are met.
- 2. To protect the interests of the learner and the school.
- 3. To ensure a learner is able to take full advantage of the educational opportunities Wakatipu High School has to offer.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Learners are to attend all scheduled classes unless unwell or attending an approved school activity.
- 2. The international staff, Deans, Kaiarahi and Subject teachers will regularly monitor international learner attendance and notify the International Director if they are concerned about a learner's attendance.
- 3. If the learner is unwell, they must inform their host parents. If they are to stay home from school, the host parent is to inform the school. The learner will be required to gain a medical certificate for medical absence lasting 3 days or greater. This also applies to repeated short term (less than 3 days) medical absence. Termination of agreement may be considered if a learner has long term needs (i.e. medical, mental health, behavioural) which are beyond what could be reasonably expected for a homestay parent to deal with.
- 4. The International Director will inform the agent and parents of a learner if they become concerned about attendance, or total attendance drops below 90% for any reason.
- 5. Interventions, including counselling will be put into place to seek to address & rectify a learner's continued absence. Parents will be fully informed of the concerns; the proposed interventions and the progress achieved (if any) of those interventions.
- 6. Discipline procedures will be taken if a learner's absence is deemed to be gross misconduct.
- 7. The International Director will notify homestay parents, parents, and agents if a learner's attendance is of concern.

Please note:

During Term 3, the International Director and the Deputy/Assistant Principal responsible for International Learners will evaluate all aspects of continuing enrolments and confirm offers of place for the following year.
